Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information. The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families'

needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.

AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

Wellbeing Tip

Should I be worried about gaming addiction?

Are you worried that gaming is becoming a problem for your child? For most kids gaming is not a problem and may never be one. It can happen playing any game - online, offline, digital or video. But for a very small number of kids, it may become a problem or an addiction.



When does gaming start to become a problem?

It's not really about how much they play; it's about how much distress it is causing them or how much it's impacting on daily routines.

If it's taking over any of these areas of their life, gaming might be a problem:

- Family
- Friendships
- School/study
- Eating habits
- Sleeping habits
- Mental health
- Physical health
- Personal hygiene

What are the warning signs?

Some signs to watch out for that indicate gaming might become a problem for your child are:

- Needing to spend more and more time playing to satisfy the urge
- Feeling unable to focus on other activities when they're not gaming
- Having problems or arguments with family or friends.
- Preoccupation with gaming, even when they're not playing
- Continuing to play even though it's causing them problems
- Playing even though they're no longer enjoying it
- Inability to reduce playing or unsuccessful attempts to quit
- Neglecting responsibilities and activities that are important or they enjoy
- Lying to people they're close to about how much time they spend playing
- Feeling sad, angry, moody, anxious or irritable when they can't play
- Craving more time to play to get game items, make progress or improve their status
- Worried that your child has a problem with gaming?
