

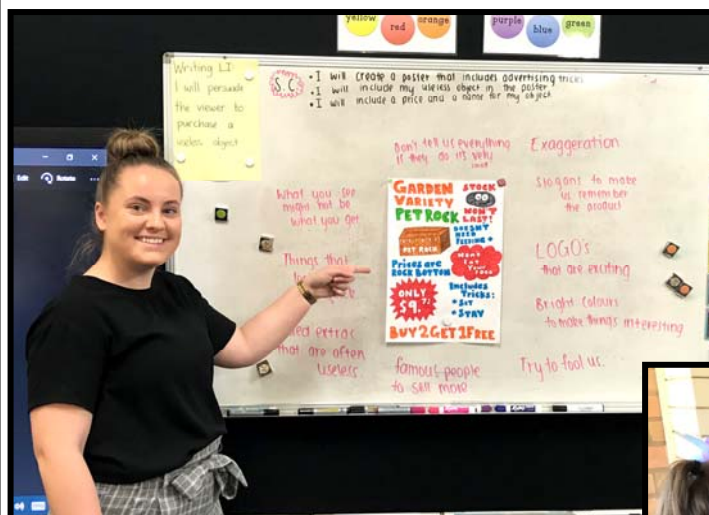

## Expression of Interest Wiradjuri Language & Culture Tutor - 2019 Middleton Public School

Expressions of interest are invited from suitable candidates interested in a career opportunity to deliver Wiradjuri Language & Culture lessons to students in Kindergarten to Year 6 at Middleton Public School, commencing in 2019. This position is one day per week during school terms.

Middleton Public School has an enrolment of 218 students, including 27% of students who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander. The school is dedicated to providing quality academic, sporting and cultural opportunities in a dynamic and supportive learning environment whilst guiding students to be responsible, confident, life long learners, who make valuable contributions within the community.

The school has a committed, collaborative and enthusiastic staff, with a mixture of experienced and early career teachers and an enthusiastic and proactive parent community. Language, Learning and Literacy (L3) and Early Action for Success (EAFS) initiatives are being embedded in school practice. Current priorities include literacy, numeracy, professional development and wellbeing. The school provides a broad range of extra-curricular activities for students.

Aboriginal language tutors are local Aboriginal language speakers. Aboriginal people are the custodians and speakers of their language and the most appropriate to share and teach their languages.

### Selection criteria

Ability to work with the Parkes Wiradjuri Language Group to deliver and teach Wiradjuri language as approved by the local community and Aboriginal Education Consultative Group.

Demonstrated ability to work closely with the classroom teacher to ensure the teaching is relevant to students' learning needs.

Ability to assist the classroom teacher to maintain records of learning and provide advice on Wiradjuri language and culture.

Demonstrated participation in Aboriginal language professional learning activities to develop effective strategies in providing tuition in Aboriginal language.

Knowledge of and commitment to the Department's Aboriginal education policies.
